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1. LNIFE AT A GLANCE

1.1 ABOUT LNIFE, GWALIOR

- 1.1.1 Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIFE), Gwalior was established by the Ministry of Education & Culture, Government of India as Lakshmibai College of Physical Education (LCPE) in August 1957, the centenary year of the War of Independence under the able leadership of Padma Shri Dr. P.M. Joseph. It is located at Gwalior, where Rani Lakshmibai of Jhansi, a valiant heroine of the war, had laid her life during the First Freedom Struggle in 1857.
- 1.1.2 The Institute started as an affiliated college of Vikram University, Ujjain and then came into the fold of Jiwaji University, Gwalior in 1964. The Institute was given a status of national importance, and hence it was renamed Lakshmibai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE) in 1973. In recognition of its unique services and character and to facilitate its further growth, the college was conferred the status of an 'Autonomous College' of Jiwaji University, Gwalior in 1982.
- 1.1.3 In further recognition of the unique educational services rendered by the Institute in the field of Physical Education, Sports and Research, the Govt. of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development conferred the status of a "Deemed to be University" in September 1995 under Section 3 of U.G.C. Act, 1956. Hence, the Institute again renamed as Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIFE). The Institute is the only "Deemed to be University" in the field of Physical Education in India and enjoys a unique place of its kind in South East Asia.
- 1.1.4 The main purpose of establishing this Institute was to upgrade the status of Physical Education by producing quality teachers and leaders through graduate and post-graduate courses. For the first time in the country, three years' Bachelor of Physical Education (BPE) was started in 1957 and two years' Master of Physical Education (MPE) in 1963. In 1980, the then college reached yet another milestone and became the first Institution in India to have offered a one-year programme of Master of Philosophy (M.Phil.) in Physical Education. The Institute also admits candidates for Ph.D. programmes on a regular basis. The Institute offers various Certificate/Diploma/PG Diploma courses in different disciplines of Physical Education and Sports. The Institute also offers some courses on Online Distance Learning mode (ODL).
- 1.1.5 The duration of Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.E.) course was initially three years. To bring it at par with other professional degree courses, as also to match the international standards, the duration of the course was extended to four years and renamed as Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.Ed. 4-year Integrated). The National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE) has accorded recognition to this course. The 4-semester M.P.Ed. Degree Course also has recognition from the NCTE.
- 1.1.6 The Institute has been certified to the parameters of Integrated Management System (IMS) comprising of ISO 9001 (Quality Management System), ISO 14001 (Environmental Management System) and OHSAS 18001 (Occupational Health and Safety).

1.2 CAMPUS

- 1.2.1 The Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE) campus is located in Shakti Nagar, on Race Course Road, at a distance of about one kilometer from Gwalior Railway Station/Bus Stand. Gwalior is situated on the Agra-Mumbai national highway and on the main North-South rail route, about 320 km from New Delhi.
- 1.2.2 The Institute campus covers an area of about 153 acres and is residential. The buildings of the Institute consist of Academic Block, Laboratories, Research Block, Language Lab, Auditorium and Administrative Block. A state of the art Library Building with all modern facilities is available in the Campus, for the use of Staff, Students, Researchers and others. There are seven Boys Hostels & four Girls Hostels; separate Mess for boys and girls, Health Center. Sports facilities ranging from an Indoor and outdoor Swimming Pool, two Indoor Gymnasium Complexes, Fitness Center, Judo Hall, Table Tennis Hall, Weight Lifting & Weight Training Halls, Squash Rackets Complex, Air Conditioned Auditorium and Unique Multipurpose Hall for Badminton, Basketball and Volleyball. It also Houses a Climbing Wall, Shooting Range, Boxing Ring and Skating Rink. The Institute has also several other well laid Play Fields for Outdoor Games and Sports like Synthetic Hockey Field, Synthetic Track & Field, Cricket field with Indoor Pitch, Football fields, Handball courts, Basketball courts, Volleyball courts, Tennis courts, Kabaddi, Kho-kho, etc. The Institute's Library stocked with Professional Books and Literature. It subscribes to several Professional and Research Journals/Magazines/Periodicals and is undoubtedly the best of its kind in India. The Research Laboratories are also well equipped with Modern and Sophisticated Equipments to cater to the Scholarly needs of the students. The Institute also runs a UGC-HRDC to conduct orientation/refresher/various short-term courses for in-service teachers from all over the country.
- 1.2.3 The campus has a sufficient number of Residential Quarters to house its Faculty, Officers, and other Employees. The Campus also has fully furnished Guest Houses, Facility Center, Workshop, Bank Branch with ATM Facility and Post Office.

1.3 ABOUT LNIPE-NERC GUWAHATI

- 1.3.1 The Lakshmibai National Institute of Physical Education, North East Regional Centre, Guwahati has been established in 2009-10 after approval from Government of India vide letter No. 2-10/2009-ID dated 20.08.2009 and signing of a Memorandum of Understanding between Government of Assam and LNIPE on 14th May 2010.
- 1.3.2 The LNIPE, NERC, Guwahati is located at Tepesia Sports Complex, Sonapur-782402, Guwahati on the outskirts of Guwahati City (Assam) at half kilometer distance away from Guwahati – Dimapur National Highway 37, which was one of the venue for the 33rd National Games, 2007. LNIPE Guwahati is situated 45 kilometers from Guwahati Airport and 27 kilometer from Railway station towards the east.
- 1.3.3 LNIPE-North East Regional Center (NERC) at Guwahati (Assam) was established by the Institute from the academic session 2009-10 with the approval of Government of India. The Center offers B.P.Ed., M.P.Ed. and Ph.D. course.

- 1.3.4 The Institute building consists of an Academic Block & Administrative Block with resourceful Laboratories like; *Sports Psychology Lab, Sport Biomechanics Lab, sport Physiology Lab and Sport Training Lab* primarily focusing on research based studies. Institute also possesses one of the best library in physical education and sport in the entire North East.

1.4 AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

- 1.4.1 The Institute has NAAC accreditation with a CGPA of 3.79 on a seven point scale at A⁺⁺ Grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (the 3rd Cycle is in process).
- 1.4.2 The Institute has been graded as Category-I Deemed to be University by University Grant Commission (UGC) in 2018.
- 1.4.3 It has granted the status of Deemed to be University in 2018 under Section 12-B of the UGC Act, 1956.
- 1.4.4 It has awarded as “Excellent Institute of Physical Education in India” in the 11th National Education Summit & Awards 2017.
- 1.4.5 It also has awarded the India 2 Grand Jury Award in Sports and Co-Curricular Education in 2019.
- 1.4.6 Granted Membership of International Association of Physical Cultural and Sports Universities-2019 at Kazakhstan.
- 1.4.7 Chief Post Master General Madhya Pradesh Circle Bhopal released “Special Cover” on LNIFE for completing 60th years of excellence (Diamond Jubilee) in 2017.

1.9.1 FACULTY OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION PEDAGOGY AND ALLIED AREAS

1.9.1.1 Department of Physical Education Pedagogy

The Department of Physical Education Pedagogy is continuously striving for excellence in Physical Education in terms of qualification, commitment and innovation; updated curriculum; teaching processes and technology.

The mission of the Department is to facilitate research and scholarly enquiry, to prepare quality professionals and to provide services in the field of Physical Education and Recreation. We embrace lifelong opportunities for discovery, learning and participation that contribute to a healthy lifestyle.

1.9.1.2 Department of Sports Management & Coaching

The Department offers various courses to prepare high quality, sport managers, physical fitness trainers, sports journalist, event managers and coaches in various games/sports with micro specializations, in

order to cater to the ever-increasing demand of the society and to uplift the standard of Indian sports.

1.9.1.3 Department of Yogic Sciences

The Department offers various courses for developing competency and enhancing skills in the field of Yoga. The main objective is to prepare Yoga experts to improve the health and quality of life of citizens.

1.9.1.4 Directorate of Open & Distance Learning

Directorate offers Post Graduate and Under Graduate Diploma Courses in Sports Management, Yoga, Sports Journalism, Sports Nutrition, Sports Analytics, Sports Event Management and Sports Psychology on Open & Distance Learning mode to cater the needs of students from various sphere of life.

1.9.2 FACULTY OF SPORTS SCIENCES

The objective of sports sciences course is to educate students in the fundamental scientific knowledge surrounding Physical Education, Sports Biomechanics, Sports Psychology and Exercise Physiology together with the skills to put knowledge into practice.

1.9.2.1 Department of Exercise Physiology

The Department aims to prepare qualified professionals at different levels to promote health and quality of life with appropriate physical activity and lifestyle behaviors. Exercise physiology is a rapidly evolving field that is becoming increasingly important in wellness, care of sportspersons and the delivery of health care. Exercise physiologists work to prevent or delay the onset of chronic disease in healthy participants or to provide therapeutic or functional benefits to patients with known diseases.

1.9.2.2 Department of Health Sciences

The Department aims to disseminate knowledge and proficiency in health care, fitness, total health through different courses by adopting a multidisciplinary approach. The objective is to re-orient the physical education professionals and other graduates in the field of health and fitness so as to generate vocational opportunities and provide services to the society for wellness and quality living.

1.9.2.3 Department of Sports Biomechanics

The Department of Sports Biomechanics caters the need of students in the area of analysis of human movements and sports techniques. Stress is laid on the development of in-depth knowledge in the area of science of sports techniques and its practical application. The graduates, after passing this course shall be able to analyse the efficiency of human movement and provide scientific backup in the area of sports techniques.

1.9.2.4 Department of Sports Psychology

The aim of Department of Sport Psychology is to understand the effects of psychological factors on physical performance and to understand the effects of participating in physical activity on

psychological development, health and well-being. The application of this understanding to real life cases is the essence of Sport Psychology.

1.10 HOSTEL AND MESS

It is mandatory for the students of B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. to reside in the hostels and take their meals in the mess. A booklet containing rules and regulations regarding discipline and conduct in the Institute's hostel and mess is given to the students at the time of admission.

1.11 HEALTH CENTER

The Institute Health Center provides treatment on a nominal fee i.e. Rs. 500/- per semester for ordinary injuries and ailments under the supervision of resident doctors. Physiotherapy treatment for sports related injuries is also available. In case of emergency, the students are referred to government-approved hospitals for further treatment. In such cases, they will have to pay the cost of treatment. Medical officers/wardens are authorized to sign on behalf of the parents/guardians for administration of anesthesia or any form of medical treatment involving risk in an emergency. All students are required to follow the Institute's rules regarding health and medical services. Students are also insured under group Mediclaim Policy.

1.12 CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The Institute promotes cultural and literary activities through the Student Cultural Club and Literary Society respectively, by providing the students an opportunity to participate in dramatics, music, debates, symposia, quiz competitions etc. The students are encouraged to involve extensively in activities like NCC, NSS, Outreach Activities, Camping and Adventure Programmes to develop leadership qualities and all-round personality development.

1.13 SPORTS PARTICIPATION

Competitive sports are an integral part of the academic programme of the Institute. Since attaining the status of Deemed to be a University, the Institute teams directly participate in the Inter University Tournaments in various games and sports. The Institute teams also participate at different levels as per its policy.

1.14 ADMISSION AND RESERVATIONS

1.14.1 The Institute is co-educational and admits candidates from India and abroad. For all courses, the reservation policy of Government of India is applicable. (except for in-service candidate from defense and paramilitary for Diploma in Sports Coaching)

1.14.2 Three percent (3%) supernumerary seats in B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. courses shall be available for the dependant son/daughter of permanent employees including those on probation, retired and serving/retired/deceased employees; provided the candidates fulfill the minimum eligibility requirements and claims that he/she belongs to employee ward category in the application form. LNIPE employee wards category candidates are required to submit a certificate issued

by the Registrar of LNIPE after certifying their family details from service book of the concerned employee.

1.16 FOREIGN NATIONALS/NRI CANDIDATES

Foreign Nationals/NRI candidates applying through Proper Channels/Diplomatic Channels in only portal i.e. through concerned Embassy or Indian Council for Cultural Relations shall only be admitted based on their credentials, attainment of minimum qualifying marks in Entrance Test and meeting acceptable standards in medical examination. At the time of registration, candidates need to submit NOC from their respective embassy.

1.17 GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

The following conditions of admission shall apply to all the candidates seeking admission in different courses:-

1.17.1 Candidates expelled from any other Board/Institute/University or dismissed from Government service on disciplinary grounds and those who known as being involved in acts of crime and gross indiscipline or misconduct will not

be eligible for admission. The Institute may approach the police for verification in this regard. After admission, if anybody found guilty in this regard, he/she will have to discontinue the course.

- 1.17.2 The medium of examination shall be either Hindi or English for all the courses.
- 1.17.3 Admission will be granted to the candidates at their own risk and candidate will be liable for wrong information (if any) furnished by them. If, at any point of time, if it came to notice, then admission granted will be cancelled and the candidate shall be asked to leave the Institute.
- 1.17.4 All the selected candidates will be required to produce the certificates (uploaded at the time of online application) in original along with following documents at the time of registration after due process of counseling within the stipulated time period for this purpose:-
 - 1.17.4.1 Format of Affidavit by the student for Transfer/Migration Certificate is given in **Annexure-7**.
 - 1.17.4.2 Affidavit by the Student for Anti-Ragging (Rs. 100/- Stamp Paper) **Annexure-8**.

- 1.17.5 Candidates failing to meet the stipulated guidelines in the qualifying examination shall not be eligible to appear in the admission test. Similarly, ineligible candidates (those who fail to deposit the required documents by the stipulated date), even after attaining a position in the merit list among provisionally selected candidates, shall not be eligible for admission.

1.18 SELECTION OF CANDIDATES

- 1.18.1 The provisionally selected candidates for B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. will undergo online counseling (choice of study center) for final selection.
- 1.18.2 The eligibility of candidates to appear in counseling shall be declared in their respective categories, which shall be purely provisional and based on declarations made by the candidates in their application forms. Therefore, the candidates are advised to fill-in the form carefully. If a candidate declares him/her passed qualifying examination and belonging to reserved category but the appropriate documents are not up to the satisfaction of the Institute or have not submitted at the time of admission, then his/her provisional selection shall stand cancelled automatically.
- 1.18.3 The provisionally selected candidates will be required to undergo a medical test conducted by the Institute. All those who pass medical test by the Institute's doctors shall be eligible for admission.

1.19 PAYMENT OF FEES

The provisionally selected candidates shall be required to pay the fee online as mentioned in the fee structure under different **Annexure-19 to 27** for various courses. In case any student fails to deposit the fee within the stipulated period, his/her

1.20 ATTENDANCE, CONDUCT, REFUND OF FEE AND CAUTION MONEY

- 1.20.1 The Institute expects 100% attendance from the students in each subject/activity/area of the total curriculum but, due to medical leave/personal leave, etc., a relaxation of 15% may be given. In exceptional and deserving cases, the Vice-Chancellor may give further relaxation of up to 10% in attendance. Prior to one month from the date of semester examinations the student must have complete 85% attendance. In exceptional and deserving cases, the Vice-Chancellor may give further relaxation of up to 10% in attendance.
- 1.20.2 Students are expected to maintain exemplary conduct inside and outside the Institute. Breach of Institute rules may result in disciplinary action including expulsion from the Institute and the Institute reserves the right to make changes in the rules at any time, which shall be notified to the students for their compliance. All the disciplinary cases of the students shall be dealt with as per the Students' Rule Book. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration to the effect that he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and other statutory bodies/authorities of the Institute.

The best footballers (one male and one female) will be awarded this scholarship amounting to Rupees one thousand (Rs. 1000/-) each year from the interest of the fixed deposit made by the family members of (Late) Prof. R.P. Sharma.

1.24.5 OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS

Most of the States and Union Territory Governments offer scholarships to their domiciled students. In addition, scholarships are also awarded by the North East Council. As per the directives of the University Grants Commission, all the eligible SC/ST/OBC-NCL students should submit their scholarship form for the academic year by February for processing the scholarship.

Note : Award of any scholarship is liable to be withdrawn in case of unsatisfactory work or misconduct.

1.25 AWARD OF DEGREE/DIPLOMA

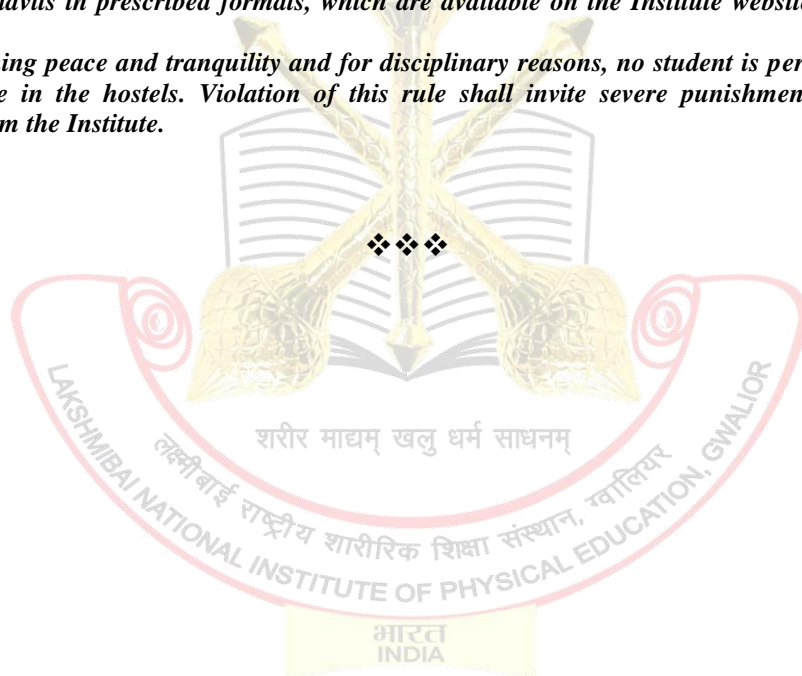

- 1.28** This prospectus supersedes all previous prospectus and their contents cannot be considered for any legal purposes. However, all disputes shall be subject to Gwalior Jurisdiction.
- 1.29** The cost of online and offline application is non-refundable.

Note:

- (i) *Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited/banned in the Institute campus as per the government orders and existing laws. 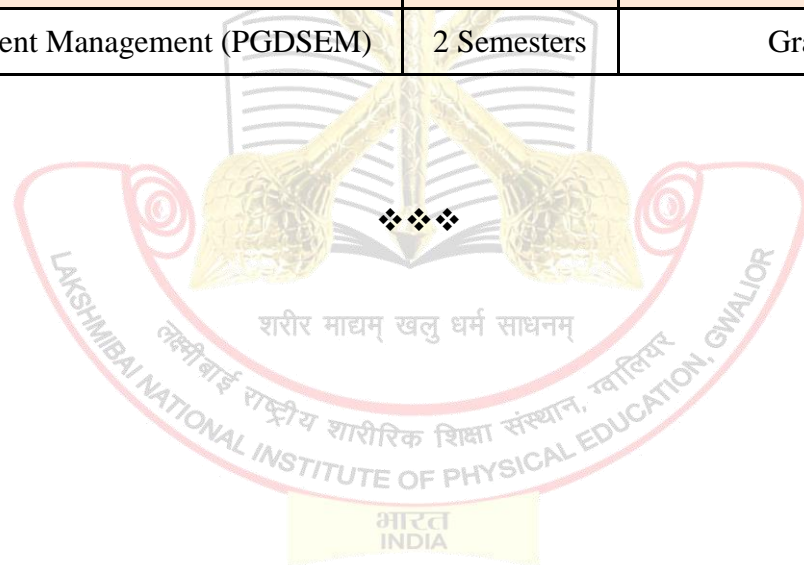

3.4 ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

A candidate shall be eligible to appear in admission test:

3.4.1 If he/she has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2) or Intermediate/equivalent examination from any recognized Education Board/ University etc. with at least 50% Marks for UR and OBC-NCL categories and 45% Marks for SC/ST category, PwD, Kashmiri Migrants & Kashmiri Pandit/ Kashmiri Hindu Families (Non-Migrants) living in Kashmir valley.

3.4.2 The maximum age of the candidate shall be 21 years as on 1st July, 2024 which shall be further relaxed up to 3 years for OBC-NCL Candidates and 5 years for SC/ST Candidates.

3.4.3 For any other relaxation related to age and percentage of marks, the advisory issued by Government of India from time to time will be applicable.

Note :

- (i) All the candidates appearing in Supplementary / Compartment in qualifying examinations for the session 2023-24 are eligible to appear in Entrance Test, but their final results must be declared on or before the last date of Registration.

3.6.3 **PHYSICAL FITNESS TEST** will be conducted at two centers LNIFE, Gwalior and LNIFE-NERC, Guwahati. Marks will be awarded in Physical Fitness on the basis of performance in following four events (400 marks) :-

- (a) 50 meters Sprint
- (b) Standing Broad Jump
- (c) Over Head Back Throw
- (d) 1000 meters Run/Walk.

The norms to convert the performance into points are given in **Annexure-12 to 15**.

Note :

- (i) *Candidates if found absent in any test event/events will be disqualified.*
- (ii) *Qualifying marks for Physical Fitness Test is 60% for UR/EWS/OBC-NCL and 55% for SC/ST.*
- (iii) *At the time of Physical Fitness Test and Sports Skill Proficiency Test, candidate should abide by the guidelines issued by the Government of India/concerned State Government regarding COVID-19.*

3.7 DIRECT ADMISSION

3.7.2 Representation shall be in such games/sports, which are approved and funded by MYAS/IOA. Such participation must be after 01st July, 2020. All such candidates who will fulfill above-mentioned criteria are entitled or will be granted direct admission.

3.7.3 All such candidates who wish to be considered for direct admission shall mandatorily apply on National Testing Agency (NTA) and upload all the documents along with sports achievements certificate. In case if the candidate is not considered for direct admission, he/she has to appear in Online Test like other candidate.
