

CHAPTER – 1

INTRODUCTION

Lakshmi Bai National Institute of Physical Education (LNIPE), Gwalior presents the Annual Report for the year 2020-21 as mandated under the provisions contained in Memorandum of Association/Rules of the Institute. This report describes activities for the period from 1.4.2020 to 31.3.2021.

LNIPE, Gwalior, formerly known as Lakshmi Bai College of Physical Education (LCPE) was established by the Government of India, Ministry of Education in 1957 the centenary year of the Indian freedom struggle, at Gwalior, where the great legend of Indian freedom struggle Rani Lakshmi Bai of Jhansi laid her life for the sake of Nation's freedom from the clutches of British rulers. As a tribute to her great martyrdom, this Institute was named after this heroine of the war of Indian Independence. The main objective behind its establishment was to uplift the stature of Physical Education in India.

Premises of the Institute, spread in 153 acres of land is known as Shakti Nagar which is located at Mela Road also known as Race Course Road, Gwalior. It is about one and a half kilometer away from Gwalior Railway Station. The Gwalior city is situated on Agra-Bombay Road (A.B. Road) highway and is well connected with other cities by all means of conveyance.



At the time of its inception, this organization was affiliated to Vikram University, Ujjain. Subsequently in the year 1964, it got affiliated with Jiwaji University, Gwalior. Keeping in mind the unique status and promising future, it was conferred the status of an Autonomous College by Jiwaji University, Gwalior in the year 1982 and named as Lakshmi Bai National College of Physical Education (LNCPE), empowering it to lay down its own admission policies, syllabi, examination systems and other such procedures of independent nature. However, the powers to confer degrees remained with Jiwaji University, Gwalior. This organization along with Netaji Subhas National Institute of Sports (NSNIS), Patiala was earlier under the administrative control of erstwhile Society for National Institutes of Physical Education and Sports (SNIPES), which was amalgamated with Sports Authority of India (SAI), New Delhi with effect from 1.5.1987.

In further recognition of unique educational services rendered by the Institute, the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development, on the advice of the University Grants Commission, conferred the status of "Deemed University" to the Institute by Notification No. F.9-14/92-U.3 dated 21.9.1995 under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. Consequently, it was de-linked from SAI and was registered as a Society namely "Lakshmi Bai National Institute of Physical Education Society, Gwalior" under the Madhya Pradesh Societies Registration Act, 1973. This is the only Deemed University in India in the field of Physical Education.





The 3-year Bachelor degree program in Physical Education in India was commenced by the then LCPE, Gwalior in the year 1957 while the 2-year Master Degree Program started in the year 1963. In the year 1980, it became the first National Level College, which commenced 1-year M. Phil Degree in Physical Education. In keeping with the over-all academic patterns and looking at the duration of professional courses in India and world-wide as well, the 3-year BPE Degree Course was discontinued and a 4-year Degree Course B.P.Ed. was introduced which has due recognition from the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) through its Western Regional Centre, Bhopal vide their order No. WRC/5-6/90/2006/C-5370 dated 26.12.2006. The Institute's 2-year Master's Degree Course M.P.Ed. is also duly recognized by the NCTE, WRC, Bhopal vide their order No. WRC/2-32/APWO 1960/214009/77/2005/7426 dated 16.9.2005.

The Institute opened its off-campus in North East Regional Centre at Guwahati (Assam) from the academic session 2009-10 with the approval of the Government of India vide letter No. 2-10/2009-ID, dated 20.8.2009. The Government of Assam signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Institute on 14.5.2010 and, thereby, handed over 275 bighas of land and in-built infrastructure at Tepesia Sports Complex, Sonapur, Guwahati to the Institute as a temporary campus site for a period of five years for NERC. Thereafter, Government of Assam signed another MoU with Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports and this Institute on 4.11.2014, whereby, the said Tepesia Sports Complex has been leased to the Institute for 20 years, with the provision for further extension of lease for another 20 years. The Institute is running 4-year BPEd in the said NERC, which is also having due recognition from the NCTE vide letter dated 31.6.2015 through its Eastern Regional Centre, Bhubaneshwar.

In the year 2010, the Institute was accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC – an autonomous body of University Grants Commission) with 'B' Grade (CGPA - 2.98 out of 4), with a validity for a period of five years.

In the year 2017, the Institute was re-accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC – an autonomous Institution of the University Grants Commission) with 'A⁺⁺' Grade (CGPA - 3.79), with a validity for a period of five years with effect from 28th March, 2017.

CHAPTER – 2

OBJECTIVES

The objectives, for which the Institute is established, are :

1. To provide higher education leading to excellence and innovations in such branches of knowledge as may be deemed fit primarily at post-graduate and research degree levels, fully conforming to the concept of university, namely, University Education Report (1948), Report of the Committee on Renovation and Rejuvenation of Higher Education in India (2009) and the Report of the Review Committee for Deemed to be Universities (2009).
2. To engage in areas of specialization with proven ability to make distinctive contributions to the objectives of the university education system that is - academic engagement clearly distinguishable from programmes of an ordinary nature that lead to conventional degrees in arts, science, engineering, medicine, dental, pharmacy, management, etc. routinely offered by conventional institutions.
3. To provide high quality teaching and research for the advancement, knowledge and its dissemination through various research programmes undertaken inhouse by substantial number of full time faculty/ research scholars (PhDs and Post Doctoral) in diverse disciplines of Physical Education.



4. To prepare highly qualified leaders in the field of Physical Education, other Inter-Disciplinary subjects and Sports/Games.
5. To serve as a Centre of excellence and innovations in Physical Education, and to undertake, promote and disseminate research and also publish literature in this field.
6. To provide professional and academic leadership to other Institutions in the field of Physical Education.
7. To provide vocational guidance and professional services to the people in this field.
8. To promote mass participation in physical education activities.
9. To undertake extramural studies, extension programs and field outreach activities to contribute in the development of the society.
10. To develop and promote programs of physical education and games/sports in Educational Institutions and other organizations.
11. To provide instructions and training in such branches viz. health & fitness, wellness, yoga and indigenous activities of learning as it may deem fit.
12. To do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or desirable for or conducive to attain in furthering the objectives specified above as may be expedient for proper functioning of LNIFE.



CHAPTER – 3

POWERS & FUNCTIONS

(A) POWERS

To carry out the functions for the management and to fulfill the objectives and manage the property of the Institute, the institute shall have the following powers :-

- (i) To establish courses of study and research and to provide instruction in Physical Education, Sports Sciences, Sports Coaching, Yoga and such branches of studies as the Institute deems appropriate for the advancement of learning and dissemination of knowledge.
- (ii) To provide fellowships/scholarships for raising academic standards and research.
- (iii) To admit students from all over India and foreign countries (countries recognized by Government of India).
- (iv) To provide opportunities to the students of the institute to participate in the tournaments and competitions and established International, National Federations, Indian Olympic Association and Association of Indian Universities.



- (v) To provide opportunities to staff and students to participate in National and international seminars, conferences, clinics, workshops, special talks and also encourage inter faculty exchange programmes.
- (vi) To have liaison / membership with various National/ International academic and professional Institutions / bodies.
- (vii) To open Regional Centre in any part of the country with the prior approval of the Ministry of Human Resource Development.

(B) FUNCTIONS

To carry-out the objectives and for the management and maintenance of the properties of the Institute, the Institute shall carryout the following functions :-

- (i) To confer degrees and to grant Diplomas and or Certificates to persons who have satisfactorily completed the approved courses of study and/or research as may be prescribed and shall have passed the prescribed examinations.
- (ii) To receive grants, subscriptions and donations for the purposes of the Institute, provided that no subscriptions or donations shall be accepted if they are accompanied by conditions inconsistent or in conflict with the satisfactory running of the Institute.



- (iii) To conduct the examinations of prescribed courses of study and to receive prescribed fee as per regulations of the Institute.
- (iv) To supervise and manage the residential students' progress, their health and discipline.
- (v) To start any new allied course/research program/ diploma/training program and discontinue any course/ training program.
- (vi) To invest the funds of the Society in or upon such Government securities as they may deem fit.
- (vii) To develop such measures as the Institute may deem fit for the benefit of any employee.
- (viii) To delegate all or any of its powers to the Vice Chancellor of the Institute.
- (ix) To make such rules and bye-laws as they may from time to time are considered necessary for regulating the management and affairs of the Institute.
- (x) To build and construct/ alter/ extend/ modify, etc. and maintain infrastructure, grounds and all other facilities and work as deemed fit by the Institute.
- (xi) To accept and receive any form of cash, immovable or movable property either unconditionally or subject to any special trusts



created by any particular donor in furtherance of any one or more of the objectives of the Institute.

- (xii) To assist the Central and State Governments in policy making for all round development of individuals through physical education.
- (xiii) To act as an Advisory Body to Government of India and other National Organizations, State Governments etc. on all matters related to Physical Education and Sports.
- (xiv) To promote and develop traditional/indigenous/tribal, modern games/sports and Yoga by providing necessary facilities and infrastructure on a large scale.
- (xv) To inculcate sports consciousness among the masses so that by their regular participation in these activities the nation is made healthy, fit and strong.
- (xvi) To provide sports and physical fitness facilities for mass participation.
- (xvii) To provide training, coaching and other back-up to elite sports persons for achieving success in their national and international events.

To provide professional leadership to physical education colleges for organizing short-term specialized courses and on other matters of professional nature.



CHAPTER – 4

NORTH-EAST REGIONAL CENTRE, GUWAHATI

Introduction

The Planning Commission in its 12th Five-Year Plan had given its in-principle approval for establishment of 4 Regional Centers of the Institute with a view to expand its activities and to achieve the aims and objectives.

The North East Regional Centre of Institute had come into existence in the year 2009-10 with the approval of Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports on receiving assurance from the Govt. of Assam, that sufficient land (100 acres) would be provided for establishment of NERC at Guwahati.

At the initial phase, the NERC of the Institute was started at Gwalior campus itself with an intake of 28 students in first batch in July, 2009. Subsequently, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between Ministry of Sports and Youth Welfare, Govt. of Assam and LNIPE on 14th May 2010 with the permission of Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, whereby the Tepesia Sports Complex (measuring approx. 100 Acres) built for 33rd National Games was given for 5 years as a temporary camp site, with a commitment to provide alternate site for the Institute's NERC in Assam.



The existing Tepesia Sports Complex was found to be the best suitable and adequate as permanent establishment of the NERC and, therefore, the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports and Institute had been trying their best to get it on permanent basis, with the result that the matter regarding long term lease arrangements and signing of MoU afresh was on 4.11.2014 Government of Assam, Ministry and LNIPE, whereby the Tepesia Sports campus comprising in an area of 274 bigha was handed over to LNIPE on long-term lease of 20 years (with provision of further 20 years extension).

Human Resources

The Government of India, Ministry of Finance had sanctioned creation of certain teaching and administrative posts during the year 2011-12 (as first phase creation) and during the year 2015-16 (as second phase creation). Most of them have been filled-up since then.

Further, considering the guidelines of NCTE/UGC to ensure proper teacher student ratio and provide effective instructional classes for B.PEd. Program, the NERC appointed 15 qualified Assistant Professors, 04 qualified coaches, 2 Computer Instructors, 1 Physiotherapist and 1 Doctor on contractual basis, NERC being fully residential.

With a view to assist in effective administration of academic program, the

supporting administrative supporting staffs (4 Junior Assistants, 2 Assistant Accountant, 1 Mess Supervisor, 1 Supervisor (B& R), 2 Drivers, 2 Electrician, 1 Plumber, 1 Cook, 2 office attendants, 1 Guest house attendant, 1 Hostel Attendant, 12 MTS) were appointed on contractual basis for one year and other maintenance staff were outsourced through agencies.

Infrastructure previously available at NE Regional Centre

The NE Regional Centre of LNIPE, Gwalior is having the following infrastructures, which were built for 2007 National Games in Tepasia Sports Complex, and these facilities are being presently used by NERC, Guwahati for its academic programs :-

Admission Process

The admission to B.P.Ed Course at NERC (Guwahati) and Gwalior was conducted by the parent institute simultaneously on All India basis. Program was published in the University Prospectus in detail through online mode and enabling students to apply admission through online. Sufficient publicity of the admission dates and procedures was made by NERC through regional newspaper of North East Region, in addition to the advertisements issued by LNIPE, Gwalior on its website. The admission tests were commenced in the last week of July and completed by first week of August. Admission process as a whole was closed in the month of August. The entire process of Entrance Test for admission during the reporting year was done through online mode.

Academic Calendar

The NERC followed academic calendar and program implemented at Gwalior. A continuous evaluation through multiple methods i.e. regular class tests, objective tests, group and self-assessment, assignment, compulsory 2 midterm test, two semesters final tests were implemented during the session 2020-21 through online mode.

Intramural

Institute authority withholds intramural competitions during the year due to pandemic situation caused on account of COVID-19 outbreak throughout the world.



Extension Services

Institute authority withheld all the activity relating to extension services during the year due to pandemic situation caused on account of COVID-19 outbreak throughout the world.

CHAPTER – 5

FACILITIES

(A) Central Library :

- (i) Central Library at LNIPE Gwalior is a true reflection of Physical Education & Sports culture of excellence and is known countrywide. The library like all vibrant and productive organizations, strives to keep pace with a global, dynamic, and technology-enabled information environment to meet the expectations of its users. Central Library during the year continued to march to its mission of facilitating the creation of new knowledge through the acquisition, organization and dissemination of library materials. It offered a range of services including reference and consultation, membership and circulation, document delivery, resource sharing, information alert service and user awareness program.
- (ii) A large number of professional books, literature & research journals are available in the library. There is a unique collection of 64788 books related to Physical Education and Sports of foreign and Indian Authors. There are interlibrary withdrawal and reprography facilities available in the Library.



- (iii) The Library is famous for rare collection of books besides being equipped with Xerox Machine, Micro Film Reader and Automatic CD-Library for use by the students and others visiting the library.
- (iv) In order to make the study material available on internet, the library has provided computers with internet facility for the use by Research Scholars. Entire area of the central library has been converted into a Wi-Fi zone which helps the scholars to download the research materials.
- (v) During the reporting year, the library has added the following numbers of books, periodicals, journals etc :-
1. Total number of books purchased - 08.
 2. Total number of periodicals subscribed by Library - nil
 3. Total number of journals received on complimentary basis - nil.
 4. Total number of online Data Base subscribed by the Central Library - 02.
 5. 08 purchased books were classified and catalogued with other technical works completed; and also made data entry in SOUL software.
 6. More than 65 students of various colleges and universities visited the library to see the facility and consult the collections.
 7. Total 15 research scholars of the field came from outside for consulting the journals, e-Journals, Data Bases, research material and rare books.
 8. The entire collection of Exercise Physiology, Sport Injury, Sports Management, Sports Psychology, Sport Sociology, Education Technology, Games and Sports, Yoga, Physical Education and its allied areas were consulted in the stack room of the central library.
 9. Most of the university students availed the facility of Wi-Fi in the library to search the research material.
 10. Circulation section of the central library had issued 50 books to the students and faculty members.
 11. NEW ARRIVALS in the library are displayed through LCD Big Screen with suitable software.

Data Bases Subscribed by Central Library :-

The institute library is also linked-up with DELNET (Developing Library Network) for searching the Articles and Books in the field of Physical Education and Sports.

The institute library has also subscribed J-Gate Data Base for providing seamless access to millions of journal articles available online offered by 12,000+ publishers. Presently, it has a massive database for journals and literature, indexed from 41,000+ e-Journals with link to full text at publishers' sites.

(I) Mess :

The Institute is fully residential for all the courses barring few, Therefore, Institute have its own Mess to cater the needs of the students on regular basis. The Mess is equipped with sophisticated equipments installed with a view to enhance hygienic conditions in the best health interest of the students. There is separate Mess for boys and girls.

(J) Health Centre :

The Institute Health Center provides treatment on a nominal fee i.e. Rs. 500/- per semester for ordinary injuries and ailments under the



supervision of resident doctors. Physiotherapy treatment for sports related injuries is also available. In case of emergency, the students are referred to government-approved hospitals for further treatment. In such cases, they pay the cost of treatment. Medical officers/wardens are authorized to sign on behalf of the parents/guardians for administration of anesthesia or any form of medical treatment involving risk in an emergency. All students are required to follow the Institute's rules and regulations regarding health and medical services. Students are also insured under group Mediclaim Policy.

(K) Internet and Telephone Facility:

The Institute has provided internet facility to all the departments, sectional heads, library, offices and guest house for effective functioning. This facility is apart from Computer Laboratories comprising of nearly 110 computers for providing internet access to the students. The Institute has also provided telephone facilities to all the departments, sectional heads, sections, as well as, at residences of faculty and other staff members with full facilities of Centrex dialing. The facility of out-going calls has also been provided to the entitled category staff with certain ceilings on functional requirement basis.

(L) Website :

The Institute's website www.lnipe.edu.in provides information



pertaining to administration, academics, admissions, advertisements, tenders, RTI etc. All the vital information for students, faculty, staff and general public is displayed and updated regularly on the website.

(M) UGC-Human Resource Development Centre :

The University Grants Commission has established a Human Resource Development Centre (earlier known as Academic Staff College - ASC) at this Institute to cater for the requirement of Refresher Courses, as well as, Orientation Courses mainly for the teachers in Physical Education from all over the country. Prof. A.S. Sisodia, Professor functioned as Director Incharge of the HRDC during the year of report. The HRDC is fully funded by the Grants-in-Aid from the University Grants Commission.

(N) Bank & Post Office :

The Institute has a full-fledged Branch of State Bank of India in its campus, which has core-banking facility and it caters to the banking requirement of the University, its staff and students. This branch, which was earlier, located in an old monumental building of University on token rent basis, has been shifted to the New Building with ATM facing to the Mela Road on monthly premium payment basis, which is a regular source of revenue generation for the Institute in addition to banking service available in the campus. There is also a Post Office in this new building of



the Institute, which takes care of postal requirements of staff and students to a great extent and of the Institute to some extent.

CHAPTER – 9

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The admission notice for the courses offered by the Institute is widely published in the National news papers, as well as, uploaded in the website of the Institute during the months of May and June and the admission process is carried-out during the months of June-July every year, but during this year i.e. 2020-21 the same was carried out in the month of Sept-Oct due to Pandemic Covid-19 situation.

All India Entrance Test is conducted for each program of study. Those candidates who fulfill the eligibility criteria are eligible to get admit cards for appearing in the entrance test. This year due to Covid-19 situation, online exams were conducted for all the courses.

The entrance test for all the courses were conducted at many places all over India during the reporting year. They were conducted at Andhra Pradesh-Vijaywada, Assam-Guwahati, Bihar-Patna, Chattisgarh-Raipur, Delhi-Delhi, Haryana-Chandigarh, Jammu & Kashmir-Jammu, Jharkhand-Ranchi, Kerala-Trivendrum, M.P - Gwalior, Indore, Bhopal, Jabalpur, Maharashtra-Pune, Orissa-Bhuvneshwar, Rajasthan-Jaipur, Udaipur, U.P - Lucknow, Allahabad, Meerut, Uttaranchal-Dehradoon, West Bengal-Kolkatta.

The selection of the candidates was done on the basis of category wise merit list prepared as per the criterion prescribed by the Academic Council of the Institute. The candidates, who were selected for admission, were required to complete the registration procedure as per schedule of registration drawn by the Institute.

The entire admission process has been made paperless. Applications, admit card and counseling were done through online mode on payment of fees.


